115.33 WATER POLLUTION CONTROL; TAX LEVIES, AS-SESSMENTS, AND SERVICE CHARGES. Subdivision 1. The board may levy taxes for any district purpose on all property taxable within the district, subject only to the limitation that the tax levy for any year-for all-purposes other than-the payment of bonds and interest-thereon-and expenses incident thereto shall not-exceed \$10,000 or ten mills on the dollar of the assessed value of all the property-taxable within the district, whichever is greater, provided that no taxes levied under this subdivision in any year shall exceed in amount \$1.50-per capita of the population of the district according to the last state or federal census, if the amount proposed to be levied in excess of such amount, when added to the levy subject to the limitations of Minnesota Statutes, Section 275.10 or Section 275.11, of any of-the municipalities-within-the district, would-cause such municipal levy to exceed the limitations of such applicable section and for a period of five years from the effective date of this act, the same shall not be subject to any limitation and shall be excluded in computing amounts subject to any limitation on tax levies .

An act relating to education; providing aid for adult education teachers.

All classes shall be tuition free when taught by teachers subsidized under this section, but this shall not preclude charging a reasonable registration fee and charging for necessary materials and supplies. An act relating to the protection of the public health and the conservation and protection of water resources, providing for the classification of all public water supply systems and all public wastewater treatment facilities and requiring the examination of operators and certification of their competency to supervise and operate such facilities.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [115.71] WATER RESOURCES; CLASSIFICA-TION OF WATER SUPPLY AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITIES; DEFINITIONS. Subdivision 1. As used in this act, the terms defined in this section have the meanings given them.

Subd. 2. "Secretary" means the secretary and executive officer of the state board of health.

Subd. 3. "Director" means the director of the Minnesota pollution control agency.

Subd. 4. "Board" means the board of certification established by section 4 of this act.

Subd 5. "Water certificate" means a certificate of competency issued by the secretary stating that the water supply system operator has met the requirements for the specified operator classification of the certification program.
