39.28 Subdivision 1. **Generally.** (a) A nonresident of the state of Minnesota who is not seeking  
39.29 licensure in Minnesota and intends to practice in Minnesota must apply to the board for  
40.1 guest licensure. An applicant must apply for guest licensure at least 30 days prior to the  
40.2 expected date of practice in Minnesota and is subject to approval by the board or its designee.
