1.8	Subdivision 1. Definition. As used in this section;

Vicarious liability or respondeat superior claims. Except as provided in paragraph (b), this section applies to actions that were not time-barred before the effective date. 2.13 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in the case of alleged sexual abuse 2.14 of an individual under the age of 18, if the action would otherwise be time-barred 2.15 under a previous version of Minnesota Statutes, section 541.073, or other time limit, an 2.16 2.17 action against a person, as defined in section 541.073, subdivision 1, clause (2), may be commenced no later than three years following the effective date of this section. This 2.18 paragraph does not apply to a claim for vicarious liability or respondeat superior, but does 2.19 apply to other claims, including negligence.
