

the by-laws of the association; provided, the total pensions hereunder for the widow and children of the deceased member shall not exceed the sum of \$125 per month;

(c) A child or children of a deceased member receiving a pension or pensions hereunder shall, after the death of their mother, be entitled to receive a pension or pensions in such amount as the board of trustees of the association shall deem necessary to properly support the child or children until they reach the age of not less than 16, and not more than 18, years, as the by-laws of the association may provide; but the total amount of the pension or pensions hereunder for any such child or children shall not exceed the sum of \$125 per month.

Sec. 4. Expiration date. The increases herein granted shall expire July 1, 1951.

CHAPTER 574—S. F. No. 104

An act relating to the regulation of traffic on highways; amending Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 169.55, as amended by Laws 1947, Chapter 428, Section 27.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 169.55, as amended by Laws 1947, Chapter 428, Section 27, is amended to read as follows:

169.55. Animal-drawn vehicles require lights. At the times when lighted lamps on vehicles are required, each vehicle including an animal-drawn vehicle and any vehicle specifically excepted in Sections 169.47 to 169.79, with respect to equipment and not hereinbefore specifically required to be equipped with lamps, shall be equipped with one or more lighted lamps or lanterns projecting a white light visible from a distance of 500 feet to the front of the vehicle and with a lamp or lantern exhibiting a red light visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear, except that reflectors meeting the maximum requirements of this chapter may be used in lieu of the lights required in this section. *It shall be unlawful to project*

a white light to the rear of any such vehicle while traveling on any street or highway.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act is in force and effect after May 30, 1949.

CHAPTER 575—S. F. No. 729

[Coded as Section 260.125]

An act relating to the youth conservation commission and amending Laws 1947, Chapter 595, Section 1, Subdivisions 3, 4, 7, 9, 10, 19, 21, 26, 36, and 37, and adding new subdivisions thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. Laws 1947, Chapter 595, Section 1, is amended by amending Subdivisions 3, 4, 7, 9, 10, 19, 21, 36, and 37, and adding new subdivisions thereto, all to read as follows:

[260.125] **Youth Conservation Act. Subd. 3. Personnel of Commission.** The Commission shall consist of *six* persons including the director of the division of public institutions, the chairman of the state board of parole, and *four* others, *at least one of whom shall be a woman*, appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate. *Three members shall constitute a quorum. The Governor shall designate one of the appointed members as the chairman who shall be the full time director of the Commission. The Director shall be responsible for the administration and enforcement of this Act under the direction of the Commission. The director of the division of public institutions and the chairman of the state board of parole shall serve without additional compensation. All other members shall serve on a per diem basis.*

Subd. 4. Term of office. The term of office of the appointed members of the Commission shall be for *six* years except that *the members serving under their initial appointment shall serve for the remainder of the terms for which they were respectively appointed. The woman initially appointed*
