

the money was so paid, and he shall attach thereto receipts and sub-vouchers for each payment so made and return to the county treasurer all of the unexpended portion thereof. After the report, receipts, and sub-vouchers have been audited by the county board and found to be correct, it may, by resolution, release the treasurer or other person and his sureties from all further liabilities under bond.

CHAPTER 174—H. F. No. 1095

An act relating to highway traffic regulations; amending Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 169.71.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 169.71, is amended to read:

169.71 **Windshields; obstructed vision.** No person shall drive or operate any motor vehicle with a windshield cracked or discolored to an extent to limit or obstruct proper vision, *or with any objects suspended between the driver and windshield, other than sun visors and rear vision mirrors*, or with any sign, poster, or other non-transparent material upon the front windshield, sidewings, side or rear windows of such vehicle, other than a certificate or other paper required to be so displayed by law, or authorized by the state director of civil defense.

The windshield on every motor vehicle shall be equipped with a device for cleaning rain, snow or other moisture from the windshield, which device shall be so constructed as to be controlled or operated by the driver of the vehicle.

No person shall drive any motor vehicle with the windshield or front side windows covered with steam or frost to such an extent as to prevent proper vision.
