

ton's Birthday, February 22; Memorial Day, May 30; Independence Day, July 4; Labor Day, the first Monday in September; Christopher Columbus Day, October 12; Christmas Day, December 25; the Friday next preceding Easter Sunday, commonly known as Good Friday; Thanksgiving Day; and Armistice Day, November 11; *provided, when New Years' Day, January 1; or Memorial Day, May 30; or Independence Day, July 4; or Christmas Day, December 25; falls on Sunday, the following day shall be a holiday.* No public business shall be transacted on *any holiday*, except in cases of necessity, nor shall any civil process be served thereon.

CHAPTER 496—H. F. No. 593

An act relating to license to operate motor vehicles; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 171.03.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 171.03, is amended to read:

171.03 **Persons exempt.** The following persons are exempt from license hereunder:

(1) Persons licensed as chauffeurs under the laws of the State of Minnesota while operating motor vehicles in the performance of their duties as such chauffeurs;

(2) Any person while driving or operating a motor vehicle in the service of the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States;

(3) Any person while driving or operating any farm tractor, or implement of husbandry temporarily operated or moved on a highway;

(4) A non-resident who is at least 15 years of age and who has in his immediate possession a valid driver's license issued to him in his home state or country may operate a motor vehicle in this state only as a driver;

(5) Any non-resident who is at least 18 years of age, whose home state or country does not require the licensing of drivers may operate a motor vehicle as a driver, only for a period of not more than 90 days in any calendar year if the motor vehicle so operated is duly registered for the current

calendar year in the home state or country of such non-resident.

(6) *Any person over 21 years of age who becomes a resident of the State of Minnesota and who has in his possession a valid driver's license issued to him under and pursuant to the laws of some other state or province or by military authorities of the United States may operate a motor vehicle as a driver, only for a period of not more than 60 days after becoming a resident of this state, without being required to have a Minnesota driver's license as provided in this chapter.*

CHAPTER 497—H. F. No. 653

An act relating to dangerous caustic or corrosive substances; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 24.02, Subdivisions 2, 3.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 24.02, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. **Dangerous caustic or corrosive substance.** The term "dangerous caustic or corrosive substance" means each and all of the acids, alkalis, and substances named below:

(1) Hydrochloric acid and any preparation containing free or chemically unneutralized hydrochloric acid (HCl) in a concentration of ten percent or more;

(2) Sulphuric acid and any preparation containing free or chemically unneutralized sulphuric acid (H₂SO₄) in a concentration of ten percent or more;

(3) Nitric acid or any preparation containing free or chemically unneutralized nitric acid (HNO₃) in a concentration of five percent or more;

(4) Carboic acid (C₆H₅OH), otherwise known as phenol, and any preparation containing carboic acid in a concentration of five percent or more;

(5) Oxalic acid and any preparation containing free or chemically unneutralized oxalic acid (H₂C₂O₄) in a concentration of ten percent or more;

(6) Any salt of oxalic acid and any preparation containing any such salt in a concentration of ten percent or more;
