CHAPTER 791—S. F. No. 1457

An act relating to fire extinguishers; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 73.30, Subdivisions 2, 3; repealing Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 73.30, Subdivision 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 73.30, Subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd 2. The state fire marshal shall adopt and promulgate reasonable rules and regulations governing the minimum specifications for approved fire extinguishers. *No fire extinguisher of a type not approved by the state [fire] marshal shall be sold or offered for sale within the state.*

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 73.30, Subdivision 3, is amended to read:

Subd. 3. Any person, firm or corporation who shall sell or offer for sale any fire extinguisher of a type not approved by the state fire marshal shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 73.30, Subdivision 1, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 792—S. F. No. 1491

An act relating to conservation areas, game preserves or other areas established under Minnesota Statutes 1953, Chapter 84A, and to the construction and maintenance of highways therein; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 84A.55, Subdivision 10.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 84A.55, Subdivision 10, is amended to read:

Subd. 10. The commissioner may construct and main-

tain and contribute funds for construction and maintenance of roads and airplane landing fields or strips within any game preserve, conservation area or other area subject to the provisions hereof. Payments for highway purposes under this subdivision may be made to any governmental subdivision or to the United States in such amounts as the commissioner shall determine from the fund created by Minnesota Statutes, Section 84A.51.

CHAPTER 793—S. F. No. 1497

An act relating to the compensation and mileage of the members of the legislature; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Sections 3.10; 3.11, Subdivision 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 3.10, is amended to read:

3.10 **Members; compensation, mileage.** The compensation of each member of the House of Representatives of the Legislature shall be \$4,800 for the entire term to which he is elected, which shall be due on the first day of the regular legislative session of the term and payable as follows:

\$200 on the fifteenth day of January, the first day of February, March and April and on the last day of the regular legislative session and the same amount on the first day of June and the first day of each month thereafter during the term for which he was elected.

The compensation of each Senator of the Legislature shall be \$9,600 for the term to which he is elected, of which \$4,800 shall be due on the first day of each regular legislative session of the term and payable as follows:

\$200 on the fifteenth day of January, the first day of February, March and April and on the last day of the regular legislative session and the same amount on the first day of June and the first day of each month thereafter in the year in which the legislature was in regular session, and \$200 on the first day of each month in the year in which no regular session is held.

In the event of extra legislative sessions, each member of the legislature shall receive additional compensation at the rate of \$25 for each day while engaged in extra session, pay-
