

CHAPTER 19—H. F. No. 153

[Coded in Part]

An act relating to the name and management of the state institution for the mentally deficient located at Faribault, the state institution for the mentally deficient located at Brainerd, and the state institution for the mentally deficient or epileptic located at Cambridge; amending Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 246.02, Subdivision 2, as amended, and section 252.015, as amended.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [252.011] **Brainerd State School and Hospital.** The school and hospital for the mentally retarded at Brainerd shall be maintained and operated under the general management of the commissioner of public welfare.

Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 246.02, Subdivision 2, as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 746, Section 1, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. The commissioner of public welfare shall act with the advice of the medical policy directional committee on mental health in the appointment and removal of the chief executive officers of the following institutions: Anoka State Hospital, Fergus Falls State Hospital, Hastings State Hospital, Moose Lake State Hospital, Rochester State Hospital, St. Peter State Hospital, Sandstone State Hospital, Willmar State Hospital, *Faribault State School and Hospital*, Cambridge State School and Hospital, *Brainerd State School and Hospital*, and Minnesota State *Sanatorium*.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1953, Section 252.015, as amended by Laws 1955, Chapter 662, Section 1 is amended to read:

252.015 State schools and hospitals. The state institution for the mentally *retarded* located at Faribault shall hereafter be known and designated as the Faribault State School and Hospital, *the state institution for the mentally retarded located at Brainerd shall be known and designated as the Brainerd State School and Hospital*, and the state institution for the mentally *retarded* or epileptic located at Cambridge shall hereafter be known and designated as the Cambridge State School and Hospital.
