

The town board of Forest Lake township in Washington county may authorize the town supervisors to levy an assessment of up to \$6 on each owner of real estate for fire identification numbers.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect only after its approval by a majority vote of the town board of Forest Lake township in Washington county.

An act establishing the Lac Qui Parle State Recreation Reserve.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [85.193] **Lac Qui Parle State Recreation Reserve.** [Subdivision 1.] The following described lands are hereby dedicated and set aside as the Lac Qui Parle State Recreation Reserve for the perpetual use of the people of the State of Minnesota, to-wit:

All lands situated in Sections 13, 14, 15, 23, and 24, Township 118 North, Range 42 West of the 5th Principal Meridian, lying between the southwesterly meander line of Lac Qui Parle Lake; westerly meander line of the main channel of the Minnesota River; and the existing northerly, easterly and westerly right of way line of the County road, said right of way line being 100' distant at right angles northerly, easterly and westerly of the following described roadway center line.

Commencing at a point in the south line of Section 13, Township 118 North, Range 42 West, 2852 feet west of the southeast corner of said Section 13; said point being the east face of the west abutment of the Minnesota River Control Dam and bridge; thence west along the south line of said Section 13, a distance of 357.3 feet to a point of curve; thence on a 3°00' curve to the left a distance of 1290 feet; thence on a tangent to last described curve, a distance of 2594.7 feet; said line passing through the east line

of Section 23 at a point 11.08.6 feet south of the northeast corner of said Section 23; thence on a $10^{\circ}00'$ curve to the right, a distance of 622.5 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve a distance of 363.5 feet; thence on a $5^{\circ}01'$ curve to the right, a distance of 199.34 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 50.69 feet; thence on a $4^{\circ}02'$ curve to the left a distance of 395.66 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve a distance of 449.11 feet; thence on a $6^{\circ}21'$ curve to the right a distance of 393.7 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 100.51 feet; thence on a $7^{\circ}00'$ curve to the right, a distance of 660.71 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 551.4 feet; thence on a $3^{\circ}55'$ curve to the left, a distance of 1136.59 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 617.09 feet; thence on a $3^{\circ}00'$ curve to the right a distance of 790.0 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 310.48 feet; thence on a $2^{\circ}44'$ curve to the left, a distance of 792.08 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve a distance of 223.12 feet; thence on a $7^{\circ}51'$ curve to the right a distance of 389.81 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve a distance of 26.79 feet; thence on a $7^{\circ}34'$ curve to the left a distance of 569.82 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 559.91 feet; thence on a $1^{\circ}46'$ curve to the right, a distance of 792.44 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 355.98 feet; thence on a $2^{\circ}00'$ curve to the left, a distance of 320 feet; thence on a tangent to the last described curve, a distance of 288 feet more or less to point in the north line of Section 15, Township 118 North, Range 42 West, said point being the intersection of center line of County road 2565 feet more or less east of the northwest corner of said Section 15.

Sec. 2. [Subd. 2.] The lands herein described shall be under the supervision and control of the commissioner of conservation and shall be administered in the same manner as all other state recreational reserves.
